Teaching Ancient Greece:

New Resources from the Panoply Vase Animation Project

The Panoply Vase Animation Project makes animations from ancient artefacts. For the ERC-funded Our Mythical Childhood project (www.omc.obta.al.uw.edu.pl), they created 5 vase animations and 4 short documentaries, featuring Herakles, Dionysus, Zeus, Iris, and Sappho.

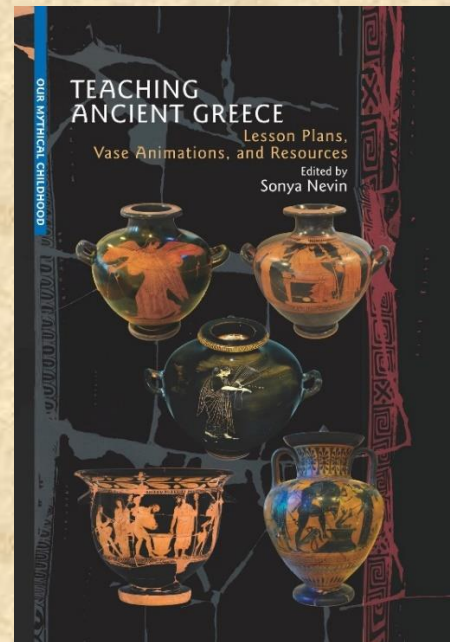
This talk, by the creators of the animations, marks the publication of *Teaching Ancient Greece. Lesson Plans, Vase Animations, and Resources* (University of Warsaw Press, 2024). This Open Access volume features lesson plans by an international team of educators using the vases and animations in the Our Mythical Childhood collection. Aimed at secondary schools, but adaptable for older and younger groups, the resources cover reading and understanding pottery, relationships, the development of drama, sacrifice, writing lyrical poetry, interdisciplinary projects, museums, a guide to making stop motion animations, and more.

The talk will demonstrate potential uses of the vase animations in educational settings and will highlight where *Teaching Ancient Greece* can provide an extra support.

Sonya Nevin is an Assistant Professor in the University of Warsaw Faculty of “Artes Liberales” working on the ERC Proof of Concept Grant Modern Argonauts project.

Steve K. Simons is an animator and illustrator.

Together they developed the Panoply Vase Animation Project (<https://panoply.org.uk>). They have animated artefacts for the Locus Ludi project on play and games, for GALATEO on Mesopotamian etiquette, and for Our Mythical Childhood.
